

Exeter Town Hall meeting

Last summer Exeter residents were asked to fill out a survey about the possibility of a new pool. With over 80 percent of the surveys responding positively, the Exeter Pool Committee took this as the indication that the town wanted to take the next steps toward building a new pool.

Recently the Exeter Village Board approved the two ballot issues that relate to the pool. Voters in Exeter will have their chance to approve or disapprove building a new pool and a new city sales tax at the May primary.

But before the vote in May, members of the community may want answers about the reality of the cost of the pool and paying for it. The Exeter Pool Committee wants to share answers with the community.

Wednesday, March 19th, the Exeter Pool Committee wants to welcome any and all members of the community to bring their questions and comments about the two ballot issues concerning city sales tax and the pool bond to this Town Meeting. The meeting will be held at the fire hall at 7 p.m.

Members of the pool committee will be present along with members of the village board, village maintenance staff, representatives from the engineering firm that is working with the city to design the pool and experts on sales tax. They will all be available to answer your questions on these two ballot issues.

There will be a drawing of the proposed pool and bathhouse design, so interested community members can see what the pool would look like. Also available will be estimated sales tax and property tax figures along with numbers on current pool expenditures.

The Exeter Pool Committee hopes that all community members will bring their questions to this meeting and get them answered.
